#### Pamela R. Harwood

Honorable Pamela R. Harwood is the Appeals Judge and Finance Committee member for the Settlement Facility-Dow Corning Trust. Judge Harwood was appointed by Chief Judge Denise Page Hood in 2014 after serving as a mediator for the Litigation Facility.

Judge Harwood retired from the Third Judicial Circuit Court in Detroit, Michigan in 2004. During her twenty (20) year judicial career, she presided over an asbestos docket that was successfully managed after the implementation of an efficient and fair case processing protocol.
